
### Methodology

An online flash poll was conducted of GBTA members and non-members worldwide, including corporate travel managers and travel suppliers


- Fielding took place from October 4 through October 13, 2021
- An email invitation was sent to 15,951 travel professionals including current and inactive members of GBTA; a link to the survey was also included in GBTA's *Daily News Brief* sent to travel professionals worldwide
- In total, 503 companies responded to the poll
- Note: Some totals might not add to 100% because of rounding; each percentage is rounded to the nearest whole number









### The State of Domestic Business Travel









### The State of International Business Travel

% of companies that have canceled or suspended most or all <u>international</u> business travel







#### How have bookings from corporate customers changed in the past month?
















# Only Some Travel Buyers Are More Likely to Contract With Suppliers That Require Vaccines

Are travel buyers more likely to contract with suppliers who require guests or passengers to prove they are vaccinated against COVID-19?











## Many Respondents Miss Traveling for Work

#### How do respondents feel about business travel?



## Strong Support for New Policy on International Travel





As a result of the Biden Administration's new requirements for international travel, do you think...?






Are respondents concerned that passport and visa delays will delay for their company's employees?








## Declining COVID Cases Could Accelerate the Return of Business Travel

#### What will accelerate the return of business travel at your company?






